



Narrative Statement in Support of Variance Application of Tri-Village Christian Church

Strict application of Section 10.17 (and 26.04 to the extent the attached plans are inconsistent with the resolution) would result in unnecessary hardship for the following reasons:

- There is substantial distance between any adjoining property and the existing and proposed structures on the Church Property and the additional structure will have no adverse impact on any adjoining residence such that a variance would not be contrary to the public interest
- 2. The length of the boundaries between the Church Property and adjoining property are substantial, such that the requirement to provide screening would be an unnecessary hardship by virtually prohibiting further utilization of the Church Property for its permitted and intended use. Further, it is arguable that the resolution would require the adjoining properties in the R-District to provide screening as well; a result likely unintended by the resolution and one certainly not desired by the applicant. To the extent that the attached pans are inconsistent with Article 26, requiring more would work an unnecessary hardship upon the applicant because any benefit resulting therefrom would be lost as a result of the sheer distance and sight angles from any relevant adjoining property.
- 3. The spirit of the zoning resolution would be observed, notwithstanding the proposed variance because Religious uses are permitted in the AG District and the adjoining R-District so long as the structure is at least 50 feet from another lot (13.1). There is substantially more than 50 feet between any structure on the Church Property and any adjoining property.
- 4. Substantial justice favors a grant of the requested variance. Additionally, the Religious Land Use Act of 2000 prohibits zoning laws that substantially burden the religious exercise of churches.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

THIRD: The purpose of this church is to preach the full gospel, plead for Christian Unity as revealed in the Scriptures, promote spiritual life and growth within the church, exercise Christian care and discipline over its members, express sympathy and compassion to the sorrowing and in every way possible extend the Kingdom of God at home and abroad, to cultivate Christian fellowship with those of like faith and accept the New Testament as final authority in all matters of faith and practice.

FOURTH: Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, and education purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions of organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

FIFTH: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 1 hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Service Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

SIXTH: Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purpose of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable or educational purposes as shall at the time qualify as the exempt organization or organizations under section 501©(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

SEVENTH: Changes in these Articles of Incorporation or any provision of the Constitution and By-Laws of this organization shall be by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the members present at any meeting of the congregation duly called for such purpose.

EIGHTH: These Articles of Incorporation (Amended) shall supersede the original Articles of Incorporation filed on August 4, 1965, as restated on September 15, 1965, and as amended on June 17, 1981.
